

# 2008 PHYC / SYC Spring & Fall Series

## NOTICE OF RACE

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The series races will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association (US Sailing) national authority will apply.
- 1.3 Individual class rules on file in writing for the current race year with the Race Chairmen will apply.

### 2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

### 3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The races are open to all sail yachts owned by members of the Port Huron Yacht Club and Sarnia Yacht Club who have properly registered with the PHYC/SYC Race Chairmen and individual classes. Yachts **must** also register and pay fees with individual classes they intend to race. Yachts can register for a single class in each series.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and sending it to Race Chairmen at the respective club prior to March 15th, 2008.
- 3.3 Yacht racing in PHRF, Cruising or Handicap A classes must have a 2008 Lake Huron PHRF Certificate.
- 3.4 Entries not received by March 15th will be considered late and may not be considered toward class/split construction.

### 4 FEES

- 4.1 There are no fees for PHYC required by the race program. SYC has fees for racing, which are shown on their registration form. The classes will set the individual class fees.

### 5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Races dates are provided on the 2008 PHYC/SYC Race Schedule located on the [www.phyc.org](http://www.phyc.org) or race program.
- 5.2 There will be a total of 12 races, 6 in each series.
- 5.3 See SI for scheduled warning signal of the first race of each day.

### 6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1 The sailing instructions will be available after May 1, 2008 as published in the PHYC/SYC Race Program. They may also be available on the PHYC Web Site ([www.phyc.org](http://www.phyc.org)) and the SYC Web Site ([www.sarniayachtclub.on.ca](http://www.sarniayachtclub.on.ca)).

### 7 CLASSES

- 7.1 Classes
  - 7.1.1 PHRF – Yachts shall race in accordance with the Lake Huron PHRF By-Laws and have a current Lake Huron PHRF rating.
  - 7.1.2 PHRF Cal25 - Yachts shall race in accordance with the Cal 25 Class rules and have a current Lake Huron PHRF
  - 7.1.3 Cruising Class – Yachts in this class shall have a current Lake Huron PHRF rating, with special limitations on sails as specified in the Cruising Class Racing Rules.
  - 7.1.4 Handicap Class – Yachts in this class shall have a current Lake Huron PHRF rating and then adjusted for skipper experience, sail age and sail usage.
  - 7.1.5 30 Square Metre – Boats in this class must conform to the 30 Square Metre Rule.
  - 7.1.6 6 Metre - Boats in this class must conform to the 6 Metre Rule.
- 7.2 Acceptance of a yacht in a class will be in accordance with the rules of that class. A yacht eligible to race in more than one class may race in the class of its choice, but shall indicate its choice on the Race Registration.
- 7.3 Registered yachts can not change classes after 72 hours prior to the first race of the Spring and Fall Series.
- 7.4 An owner of a yacht wishing to changes class must complete the CHANGE OF CLASS FORM and have it approved by both the Class Representative and Race Chairmen by the time shown in 7.3.
- 7.5 Formation of a class
  - 7.5.1 Six or more yachts are required and the approval of the PHYC and SYC R.C. boards.
  - 7.5.2 Classes must maintain a minimum of 4 yachts registered
  - 7.5.3 Three yachts or less a class will be dissolved
  - 7.5.4 The PHYC and SYC R.C. Organizing Authority may at their discretion, choose to allow a class with less than 3 yachts or less to continue as a class.

### 8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 Windward/Leeward Courses will be used for PHRF & One Design.
- 8.2 Triangular Courses will be used for the Cruising, Handicap, 30 Square and 6 Metre classes.
- 8.3 See sailing instructions for course details.

## **9 SCORING**

- 9.1** The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A will apply, unless written class rules are on file by May 1<sup>st</sup> for the current year with the Race Chairmen. See SI for additional details.

## **10 RESULTS**

- 10.1** Preliminary results will be posted on the official notice boards as soon as possible following a race. Corrections or errors need to be reported to the Race Chairmen, Fleet Captain or the Race PRO in writing. If no corrections are reported within 72 hours, results will become final. Skippers are reminded that the club website is not the official race results bulletin board.

## **11 PRIZES**

- 11.1** Flags and engraved cups will be given to the top three finishers in each class for each series, as well as the top three overall in each class. Perpetual trophies awarded to the top finishing overall boat in each class.

## **12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

- 12.1** Competitors participate in the races entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the races.

## **13 INSURANCE**

- 13.1** Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.

## **14 CLASS RESPONSIBILITIES FOR RACE COMMITTEE BOATS**

- 14.1** Class Captains are responsible for the race committee boat assignments that their class is assigned. This responsibility includes providing information to the PRO prior to the race and for the duration of the race a competent race committee boat and crew. Classes should plan to provide seven people as crew for the race. This crew will function under the direction of the PRO of the day. A class that fails to meet these responsibilities may be protested by Race Committee and assessed a penalty by the Protest Board.
